- **5. Minutes of the Previous Meeting (November 18, 2016):** Melanie/Janice made a motion to adopt the minutes as circulated after 1 correction was made on page 3, 8. b. (We did receive the refund for fabric). Carried.

### 7. Business Arising From the Minutes:

#### a. Leaders' Conference 2018 -

- Leader's Conference 2018 will be held at the Radisson Hotel in Edmonton January 19-21, 2018.
- Carole thanked everyone for their participation at WRLF with East Centrals Hee Haw invite to Leaders' Conference 2018.

- Committee meeting on April 4, 2017 @ 5:30 pm Coronation Hall to plan for conference.

### b. Consumer Decision Making-

- Drumheller District is hosting a Regional Consumer Decision Making on April 20, 2017 @ Morrin School from 1-5 pm. Cost \$5. Deadline to register is April 12. Call Melanie @ 772-0000 or email- tmnelson@netago.ca

### c. East Central Scholarship Fund-

- The scholarship fund has \$36311.24. The region disperses \$3750 annually. Seven scholarships were given out last year.
- Discussion held re: East Central Region choosing their own scholarships in order to make East Central 4-H members eligible for Alberta scholarships.
- Tracy/Janice made a motion to move East Central Regions scholarships out of the Alberta Scholarship process and have the East Central Region choose it's own scholarship recipients.

## d. Program Grant from 4-H Foundation of Alberta-

- East Central received \$2568.00 from the Foundation for the Regional Heifer Show. Discussion held that this amount is not needed for the heifer show and the need for funds for other programming.
- Rick/Melody made a motion that East Central ask the Foundations permission to redistribute the AFSC portion of the heifer show grant to member programming. Carried.
